

ASCLS-MN Proposed Bylaws Changes

A thorough review of the ASCLS-MN Bylaws was prompted by concerns about unfilled positions on our Board of Directors, which made it difficult for the board meetings to have the quorum needed to conduct official business and pass motions. During the review of the bylaws, a number of other minor updates were identified.

The proposal to remedy the issue of vacant board positions is to reduce the number of areas in Minnesota from five to three. A map of the proposed areas is included (below). Some of the previous five areas have not been represented by any directors in recent years. The Board will then consist of the officers plus six area directors, all of whom will be voting members. The size of a quorum for board meetings is being proposed to be the presiding officer (president or president-elect) plus five other Board members.


In addition to the changes affecting the Board of Directors, the quorum for business meeting(s) of ASCLS-MN is being proposed to change from 35 to 25 members.

The proposed changes were submitted to the national ASCLS Bylaws Committee for their review, which has been completed. They made several suggestions for improvement, mostly editorial in nature. A complete version showing changes is attached. See link below for the drafted changes.

The bylaws changes will be presented at the annual ASCLS-MN Membership meeting on Thursday, April 4th for review and approval.
